Please remember that the children will be breaking up for the Half term holiday **tomorrow**, as Friday 9th February is a Teacher Training Day. School will re-open to pupils on Monday 19th February. Swimming will continue till the end of the Spring term.

Book Week

Book Week is the week beginning 6th March. There are a number of activities happening, so here is an outline of what is going on each day with information about anything you need to do or bring. If you have any questions, please do ask!

Monday 5th March – there will be a special assembly where we will be looking at the books and book marks the children have made and awarding prizes. This is a voluntary competition for children in Year 1 – Year 4 who want to make their own books at home. Reception and Early Years will be making book marks. Please make sure the children send their entries in on Monday morning at the latest.

Tuesday 6th March – children come to school dressed as a character from a book (not a film!). Can they also please bring the book with them to school that day. We will have a whole school assembly first thing where all the children can show us who they have dressed as. Parents and grandparents are invited to stay for the assembly.

<u>Wednesday 7th March</u> - there will be a whole school visit to Cragside with a book theme! Children will visit the house and have an opportunity to handle some of the artefacts and talk about the people who lived and worked there, and collect pictures and materials to make a class story or non-fiction book. This is a whole day visit, so Nursery children will be collected at 3.15.

<u>Thursday 8th March</u> – Whole School trip to Hexham to visit Cogito Books and Hexham Library. Children will be able to spend their World Book Day vouchers and prize winning book tokens. Can Class 2 please bring library tickets if they have them, and they can choose books while we are in there. We will get the bus there and back and return to school in time for lunch.

Friday 9th March – sharing work we have done during Book Week. Class 2 will also spend time reading to Class 1.

Please use your Half term holiday to get ready for Book Week. Competition entries need to be ready for:

Monday 5th March – Make a Book (Year 1 – 4) and make a Book mark (Early Years) competition Tuesday 6th March - Dress up as a Book character

Sponsored Ramble and Treasure Trail Sunday 29th April
