Dear Parents,

There had been so many items completed in the Summer term and some completed items this term. There were a great many prizes awarded, too many to list here, but we have congratulated the children in our celebration assembly and there will be a display of those entries that won prizes in our porch area soon.

Last weekend was also busy with the school's attendance at <u>St Helen's Church Open Day</u>. We were there, with a stall selling the wildflower seed packets (seeds kindly donated by Mr Hilton) that the children had personally decorated and a beautiful array of paper flowers, all handmade by the children. We also managed to throw in a song and had the whole church sing All things bright and beautiful, with Mr Deasy accompanying us on the organ. It was so lovely to see so many of you there, and thank you for your support with this. The children did a great job selling their goods and we managed to raise just over £57!! Well done everyone, a great joint venture.

This week has seen the children put themselves forward for positions in the <u>School Council</u> and took part in an election. Representatives from each class have been appointed. Well done to Charlotte and Eilidh from EYFS, Emily and Rebecca from Class 1 and Owen and Tabitha from Class 2. Their first project will be to help with a celebration event for a 'new' addition to our school which will join us in the next few weeks (see below) and meeting regularly to help staff shape the Whitley Chapel ways.

You may well have seen a few mentions in Hexham about this. It has recently been mentioned on Look North with a flock of illuminated 'sheep' being housed at different locations around the North-East; this weekend they have

We're delighted to be part of a NEW Arts Trail that is set to light up Northumberland.

They will then be distributed to 40 venues across Northumberland as part of an art trail starting 24 Oct. Before the Summer holidays I made an application to 'house' a sheep, and it was announced during the Summer break that we were one of the successful venues.

Our Texel 'sheep' will be on site from 18th October, for 6 weeks, and there is an event planned at Hexham Mart on that day to collect our sheep. A group of children will attend.

We are intending to show our sheep within the sensory garden area at the front of the school. You will be aware that this area needs some attention, and the children have been brainstorming ideas on how to transform this area, from covering it with straw to building a shelter/benching or planting colourful shrubs to decorating the area/the sheep with knitted items such as a Whitley Chapel blanket or a uniform. We envisage that the area will usable long after the sheep has been removed.

Once we have an idea of the final outcome that the children would like we would welcome any support that can be offered to help us get this area ready. (Also, if you have any ideas please let us know). This is an ideal opportunity to showcase our school to others in the wider community and beyond and to help raise the profile of the arts, farming and the natural environment across a wide audience.
