Reception -counting to 10/20, counting on within 10, recognising & ordering numerals to 10 and beyond, matching numerals to quantities, naming and describing 2D shape, continuing and creating repeating patterns, practical addition including number bonds to 5, practical subtraction.

## Language and Communication

Listen to and join in with stories and rhymes. Respond to simple instructions. Talk freely and in a group about ourselves, our likes and dislikes, our families and related experiences and traditions. Begin to consider and discuss similarities and differences. Understand and answer how and why questions. Retell events from own lives, explaining and connecting ideas.
