PE kit

There has been a steady trickle of responses to the question I posed last term – thank you for the time taken to send in a response. From the 24 replies a quarter were not in favour of the PE kit change (children coming into school in PE kits). In school we have seen PE lesson time increase and children more readily available for learning. However, I understand that this arrangement does not suit everyone, therefore I am proposing a hybrid system where children can come dressed in PE kit if they wish to continue doing so on their PE day (Monday) or bring kit with them. The second PE lesson of the week for Spring 1 and 2 will be swimming on Tuesday afternoon. <u>A letter outlining what is needed will be sent out before the end of term.</u> Arrangements remain unchanged for Early Years.

Ways to communicate

Mrs North is available to talk to most mornings whilst securing the perimeter gates and continues to offer Tuesday and Thursday Open Door afternoons (1pm – 3pm) if you'd like to pop in and see her, or make an advanced appointment. She is around at the end of a day in various places but you can call into Reception to speak with her. If easier you can call Gillian to pre-book an appointment. In the first instance though it is best to see your child's teacher, and then if further discussion is needed, an appointment with Mrs North. Just a reminder that emails to the school office are looked at on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday when the Office is open, and messages can be left on the phone's answering service on other days. There may be a slight delay with responses to messages relayed in these ways on a Wednesday and Friday but we do endeavour to get back to you as soon as possible.

All funds raised will be used by the CEG for local environmental initiatives. Previous events have involved:


- Fruit tree planting and general tree planting
